

1. **"Untitled"** (corner of South Main St. and Memorial Rd.) by internationally known sculptor Charles O. Perry. Born in 1929, he studied architecture at Yale but is best known for his large-scale public sculptures such as "Continuum" at the National Air & Space Museum in Washington D.C. and "Harmony" at Bushnell Park.

2. **Noab Webster** (South Main St. in front of library) This 15-foot statue by Boston-born artist Korczak Ziolkowski was chiseled from a 52-ton block of Tennessee marble in the early 1940's. The modest \$5,700 payment by the town so infuriated the artist that he created the work on the Town Hall lawn and sold marble chips to the audience.

3. **WPA Murals** (within Town Hall, 50 South Main St.) painted by West Hartford artist Walter O.R. Korder (1891-1962) with assistance by Hall High School students. These rich and colorful panels

depicting Connecticut history were commissioned during the Great Depression by the federal government's Works Project Administration.

4. **Outdoor Labyrinth and Memorial Garden** at First Church of Christ Congregational (12 South Main St.). The eleven circles of stone and lawn are reminiscent of the labyrinth at Chartres Cathedral in France. Labyrinths have been used for centuries as a method of prayer.

5. **CT Veterans Memorial** (northwest corner of Main St. and Farmington Ave.) Dedicated in 2006, this circle of stone is interrupted by each war or military conflict that has involved the United States. Waters from the seven oceans and earth taken from battlefields, cemeteries, and P.O. camps are buried within the center of the ring. The names of veterans stand as a testament to their service.

6. * **"The Bear"** (WHAL, 37 Buena Vista Rd.) by CT sculpture Peter Busby. Hand-bent iron and carbon rods come to life in this 2008 installation, the first piece in the West Hartford Art League's Public Art Program.

7. * **"Chaos"** (WHAL, 37

Buena Vista Rd.), installed 2008, by Tim Prentice of West Cornwall, CT Born in 1950, he was first an architect (Yale) and then gained an international reputation as a kinetic sculptor. His pieces from aluminum, lexan, stainless steel and feathers utilize light and air to create movement. Locally, his work can be seen at the Bradley International Airport ("Red Zinger").

8. **3 Sculptures** installed in 2007 (within Duffy School library, 95 Westminster Dr.) by CT sculpture Michael McLaughlin. Trained at the

Lyme Academy of Fine Arts, his award-winning sculptures and reliefs are cast in bronze and often utilize objects found in nature.

9. **ArtWalk Mural** (painted on the side of Jerry's Artarama in Elmwood) was produced by Hall and Conard High School art students under the direction of JoAnne Barry Dutro and Sheri Ellis, to help celebrate Artwalk's 5th Anniversary.

10. **Three Horses** (South Main St. and Memorial Rd.) These life size horses by CT sculptor Karen Petersen are sculpted and then cast in bronze. Karen earned a B.S. from the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor; and attended Parsons School of Design, where she studied under sculptor Chaim Gross.
